



Are you having a procedure for kidney stones?

You may be eligible to participate in a research study about kidney stones at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia!

What are the goals of the study?

- Improve outcomes for kidney stone surgery.
- Improve the ability of pediatric patients and their caregivers to select surgical treatment options for kidney stones.
- Help urologists identify and use techniques that result in the best outcomes for these surgeries.

Who can be a part of the study?

Patients between the ages of 8-21 years old who are having surgery (ureteroscopy, shockwave lithotripsy, or percutaneous nephrolithotomy) for kidney stone removal.

What will participants be asked to do?

You will provide medical history and complete various questionnaires about pain, anxiety, psychological stress, relationships with peers, and urinary tract symptoms.

You will receive compensation for your participation.
